Sample Project #2

Project: to make children friendly restaurants

Language learning goals:

- Students understand and apply vocabulary about food and restaurant.
- Students understand how to introduce a fun restaurant.

Entry event:

- **Option 1**--Discussion: What are your favourite restaurants? Is there anything you want to improve? Are there any perfect restaurants for children in our city?
- **Option 2**--Story: Elena is 7 years old. Yesterday she went to a restaurant with her mom. The table was too high and she didn't like the food. Many of her friends complain about the same problem.

Driving question:

What can we do to help to make the restaurants in our city more children-friendly?

Project details

Possible options:

- A restaurant manager asks you for advice on how to improve his restaurant to make it more children-friendly.
- You're a restaurant manager and decide to create a new children-friendly restaurant.

Sample Project #2

► Entry events (Video, Readings, Main chapter theme, Dialogue, Discussions etc.)
Main chapter theme: The backpacking family 2
Background: Nick's family went travelling in Japan. When they were in trouble, a local family lent their hands, which made their journey enjoyable.
► Real-world connection
Entry event: But nowadays, people seem to give less and less caring about people around us, even our neighbours.
▶ Driving questions (Create your driving question(s)
DQ: What can the students do to raise the awareness of caring about our neighbours in the community?
► Project details (Specifics of the project)
1. poster/brochure: put pictures, suggestions on it to raise the awareness.
2. survey: to survey on students' opinions on helping others and make a conclusion and solution.
3. play/drama: to show what will happen if we are helped or not helped.
4. poem/song: to make up a song/poem to raise the awareness
5. video: can include interviews/stories

► How learners will share their projects

- 1. Posters or brochures can be showed on the wall and students walk around to see and choose their favourite one.
- 2. Surveys can be showed in ppt and students can do presentation at the front. Or students can have the rotation fair to make them feel safe to express.
- 3. Plays or dramas can be played in class or be videoed and showed for students. They should select their favourite one.
- 4. Poems or songs can be read or sang before students. They can also make a poster for their poems or songs and present them.
- 5. The videos can be showed in class and each group will get a blank-filling form.

Sample Project #3

Step 1. Entry event:

There is a latest film (*The Bad Genius*) showing that people cheat in exams in a high-tech way. Nowadays in school, an increasing number of students take a risk to cheat in exams for a high score.

Step 2. Driving question:

What can we do to raise the awareness of being honest in exams?

Step 3. Project option:

- (1) As the chairman of the Student Union, write a letter to the students or the principal. Or give a speech in front of the students.
- (2) Make a poster.
- (3) Make a play / drama / video. (story about a boy being caught because of cheating)

Step 4. Sharing:

- (1) Show the letter or poster on the Gallery Wall.
- (2) Show the play / drama / video in front of class.
